
CHAPTER 193

**AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO PLAYGROUNDS,
PARKS AND RECREATION AREAS**
(Walter A. Wysocki Park)

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Haverhill that Chapter 193, Article II, §4, Curfew; Loitering, as amended, be further amended by adding the following in subsection A:

“(4) No person or group of persons shall stand, assemble, congregate, loiter, remain, walk about or cause a disturbance or disturb the peace in the Walter A. Wysocki Park between ½ hour after sunset and 8 a.m.”



Chapter 193: PLAYGROUNDS, PARKS AND RECREATION AREAS

ARTICLE I Golfing Activities [Adopted 5-22-1973 by Doc. 86-D (Ch. 193, Art. I, of the 1980 Code)]

§ 193-1. Golfing activities prohibited.

It shall be unlawful at any and all times for any person to engage in any golfing activity whatsoever on any area in the City of Haverhill designated as a school playground.

§ 193-2. Violations and penalties.

Any violation of this article shall be subject to a fine of not more than \$50.

ARTICLE II Curfew; Loitering [Adopted 6-29-1976 by Doc. 104 (Ch. 193, Art. II, of the 1980 Code)]

§ 193-3. Loitering in public recreation areas prohibited; hours. Editor's Note: During the 2007 recodification, this section was moved to this article from its original location as § 175-3 of Ch. 175, Loitering, of the 1980 Code. **[Added 7-14-1970 by Doc. 113]**

When requested by a police officer who is on duty, no person or group of persons shall stand, loiter, remain in and/or about any public park or parks, playground and/or recreational areas owned, controlled or maintained by the City of Haverhill, or on any street or way to which the public has access and which is adjacent thereto, between the hours of 11:30 p.m. and 6:00 a.m., whether in any vehicle or otherwise, unless it shall appear that such person or group of persons has obtained written permission from the Chief of Police or from any other lawful authority empowered for such purposes by virtue of any ordinance of the City of Haverhill or statute of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

§ 193-4. School areas; Swasey Field; Union-North Street Playground; McMurrer Park

A. Designation of areas.

- (1) No person or group of persons shall stand, assemble, congregate, loiter, remain, walk about or cause a disturbance or disturb the peace in any school area, school playground area or Swasey Field in the City of Haverhill between 1/2 hour after sunset and 1/2 hour before sunrise.
- (2) No person or group of persons shall stand, assemble, congregate, loiter, remain, walk about or cause a disturbance or disturb the peace in the Union-North Street Playground between 8:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m. **[Added 10-1-1985 by Doc. 152]**
- (3) No person or group of persons shall stand, assemble, congregate, loiter, remain, walk about or cause a disturbance or disturb the peace in McMurrer Park between 1/2 hour after sunset and 8:00 a.m. **[Added 10-6-1992 by Doc. 143]**

- B. It shall be the duty of any police officer, auxiliary police officer or constable to order any person violating this section to move from the area designated above and, if such order is not obeyed forthwith, to arrest such
